- \* Read aloud together.
- \* Read Poetry.
- \* Be creative and try to write your own poem about an animal, the weather, or places you have visited.
- \* Practice 2nd Grade Words.
- \* Find the words in books that you are reading.
- \* Practice math facts and practice counting coins.
- \* Make up a pretend grocery or toy store and use coins to buy things from your store.
- \* Practice writing 2nd grade words using a variety of things such as magnet letters, shaving cream, Scrabble letter tiles.
- \* Practice counting using various number patterns.
- \* Skip count by 2's, 5's, and 10's.
- \* Practice coloring, cutting, and pasting.
- \* Try some at-home science experiments.

## STEM/Career Options

- \* Watch a baking or cooking show. Bake a new recipe with your family.
- \* Use items around the house to build a fort.
- \* Reuse recyclable materials to build something useful (for example a bird feeder from a milk carton).
- \* Help a family member fix something around the house- a broken toy, or furniture.
- \* Use building toys, like Legos, to make creations.
- \* Use a ruler or tape measure to measure objects around the house.
- \* Read a newspaper. Use sticky tabs or markers to note different occupations you find in the newspaper.
- \* Track the daily weather and create a graph.
- \* Make up your own letter code and then use it to write a note to someone. They will need your code to figure out what you wrote.
- \* Learn your parents' house and cell phone number. Learn your address.
- \* Put a puzzle together with your family.

# Social-Emotional Learning

- \* Play board games and card games together.
- \* Practice calmness. Try to be calm and still.
- \* Express and explore emotions through charactes or role playing.
- \* Practice a new skill to become more independent (for example: tie your shoes).
- \* Write or draw daily in a journal to document this experience.
- \* Sort through and organize family photos.
- \* Write thank you or love notes to family and friends.
- \* Make a future plan and set some goals.
- \* Write positive things about your family members on sticky notes, small pieces of paper, etc. and place them around the house where they will find them.
- \* Call your grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins or friends.
